## County Roads and Equipment Report January, 2020

t hodom son

January 10<sup>th</sup> brought heavy storms to the county which put to test some of the fixes which have been applied to the county road system:

The Dean Road bridge worked perfectly without overflow or washout. We estimate that the improvements there could handle twice the rain we experienced this time without any damage to the roadway.

The concrete slab (flow-over) on Round Springs Road worked perfectly and could have handled much more flow than we experienced.

The Old Highway 9 project worked amazingly well. That area could have handled much, much more.

Buttercreek Road, in addition to the new bridge, we installed a lot of additional drainage and built the road up on the gravel road part. Efforts there worked perfectly.

Moore's Lake Road had one area which washed out. We were concerned about that area because, to drain the road off correctly, would put water directly into someone's house. We will go back and trench/drain that area to protect both the road and the house.

Watson Road project... the road was draining water into someone's house. The fix worked.

We have several more places to apply permanent fixes but we are eager and excited to move ahead knowing our efforts are paying off.

We have a plan for road improvements in 2020. That plan is on a map in the hallway outside the County Judge's Office.

Because we are in the rainy season, we are trying our best to "not fix what isn't proken." Graders are being methodical in where they blade as to fix the road without creating future issues with muddy and soft roadways.

Brush work is continuing non-stop.
