Chip/Seal overlay work was completed on Sequioah Ranch Road which was one of the first roads within the county to receive a chip/seal surface.

Spot chip/sealing was completed as needed on Old Highway 9, Old Gin, Ranch, Black Hills, and North Fork Roads.

The road improvement project is continuing at Rex Road.

Scheduled for work ASAP are Rumley Road, Banner Mountain at Nixon Hill, Oak Tree and Crowell Mountain Roads.

Parts needed for repairs are presenting an issue. The supply chain is so disrupted that simple parts are taking weeks to acquire. Hopefully, this issue will resolve in the months ahead.

Grading is occurring as well as mowing/brushing continuously.

The chip/seal equipment has been sent to FFB per our agreement to share equipment which saves us all money.
