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MISCELLANEOUS HELPFUL INFORMATION

1. DO NOT WAIT – if you know or even think you might have an expense that you will not be able to pay DO SOMETHING NOW.
2. DO NOT EXPECT INSTANT HELP. Assistance Programs take time. Sign up early for rides, to get on waiting lists, etc.
3. DO NOT STOP with the first program. Keep looking and applying for alternative help. Better to get a little help from several resources than put all your hope on one resource that cannot give you everything you need.
4. Be HONEST about your situation. If you “fudge” information it’s likely you will not receive assistance (and may end up with a reputation of being untruthful).
5. WRITE A NOTE. IF you receive assistance from a church or small non-profit, write a thank you note. Individuals have contributed personal funds to help you. They want to know how their money has helped someone.

ITEMS YOU MAY NEED WHEN APPLYING FOR HELP

Having these items with you, shows you are serious about attaining assistance. Be prepared to fill out an application!

- Valid Photo Drivers License or Valid Photo State ID Card
- Proof of need (copy of the bill)
- Names & Phone numbers of references (current/previous employer, friend, and unrelated person who knows your need
- Anything else you have that will prove who you are and that you have a valid need
- Fire Report

(you may also need some of the following)

- Birth Certificate(s) for all family members
- Social Security Card(s)
- Proof of Income – pay stubs, last year tax statement, (not usually bank statements)
- Most Recently Dated Medicaid/Medicare Card
- A current Decision Letter from your local Board of Social Services Office Services or Social Security, Food-stamps, stating the amounts you are receiving
- Should you be disabled, a copy of your most current Med-1 Form from your County Social Services Office or your Social Security Decision Letter stating your disability
- Proof of any and all of the programs that you are attending
- Hospital’s Charity Care Papers
